## What is the Emmaus Gift Fund?

A love offering for emerging Emmaus Ministries communities around the world.

The Emmaus Gift Fund provides support to emerging communities around the world and to their regional representatives. Currently, there are seven emerging communities: Kenya, Bolivia, Peru, Chile, Argentina, Poland, and Bulgaria.

## How you can partner

- **Monetary Gifts**

It takes three to five years to develop a community outside the United States, and it typically costs **\$80,000**.

- **Pilgrims:** \$20,000 for men and women to be sent on a Walk to another community, oftentimes in another country, and to be trained to serve on the leadership team for their emerging community.

- **Teams:** \$60,000 for Emmaus teams to go host two Walks per year, one for men and one for women, for the emerging community for three years.

- **The Gift of Service**
